## **TEAM SCENARIO**

### **Scenario 1 –“Winter Wipeout”**

#### **Background Scenario**

You and your team are Providing First Aid Services at the local “Winter Wonderland” winter festival. It is a cold, March morning (-15) and your team is on site at the snow mobile races taking place in a forest path and large field.

In the final turn out of the forest, you suddenly see a single snow mobile travelling at a high rate of speed that goes off track and begins to flip in the air. The driver and passenger both go flying through the air before landing against a heavy wooden fence.

You have 20 minutes to complete the scenario, Good Luck!!

There will be a 3 minute warning to signify the end of the primary survey.

There will also be a 2 minute remaining warning to signify the end of the problem.

**Scenario : “Winter Wipeout”**



Total Patients: 2 people – 1 Driver and 1 passenger of a snow mobile, both dressed in snow suits. Driver is wearing a helmet. Passenger is NOT wearing a helmet.

There is a snow mobile race that during the last length of the race, a single snowmobile with a driver and passenger goes off track and flips through the air. The driver and passenger are thrown and land near a large fence post.

Driver is located supine (on their back) laying parallel right beside the fence. Passenger is found lying prone (face down) without a helmet on, heavily breathing with major facial trauma and blood in a large puddle under the head.

**NOTE:**

- There will be a 3 minute warning to the judges to signify the end of the primary survey.
- There will also be a 2 minute remaining signal for the team’s benefit.

**PROPS (Per Scenario/Team)**

- 2 patients;
  - 1 (Driver) wearing snow suit and a snowmobile helmet,
  - 1 (passenger) wearing a snow suit.
- Snowmobile helmet x1 (for Driver)
- Fence (table turned on its side or wall)
- Large volume of blood for facial injury on passenger
- Manikin for possible use by passenger attendants to demonstrate OPA insertion.
- First Aid kit/ Oxygen kit with BVM/ OPA and suction devices
- Spinal Immobilization supplies (2 sets) - Backboards, Straps, c-collars and tape
  - Please properly measure driver and passenger for proper size and inform judges to score teams accurately.
- PCRs and pens

**Casualty 1 –Driver:**(lying supine parallel directly beside fence, conscious)

**HISTORY:**

- You were driving the snowmobile in the race and noticed that the steering of your machine wasn't responding as normal (hard to steer). You and your passenger had just left the forest trail for the finish line in the middle of the field when you went to make the final curve and the steering would not respond. Your machine left the path and went over a bank – launching the machine into the air. You landed with your back against the fence and fell to the ground where you are laying currently.
- You are concerned over your passenger (friend) because you saw them fly head first into the fence before being thrown backwards again. You can hear them having a hard time breathing and are very concerned.

**Casualty 2 – Passenger**(Lying prone, NO helmet, Unconscious, Airway issue)



Information	Casualty Simulation Required
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Unconscious passenger of the snow mobile with significant facial trauma and airway compromise.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Explain to casualty about being able to breath deeply and making gurgling sounds though out scenario.</li> <li>Explain that AMFR/PRO teams may state an oral airway however they will be stopped for inserting into the real casualty.</li> <li>Explain that the teams may provide BVM ventilations for this patient and that they need not panic. Simulators may want to demonstrate this skill to the patient as to not become upset during actual scenario.</li> </ul>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Possible Spinal Injury</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>No Simulation required.</li> </ul>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Facial Trauma</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Moderate facial trauma, unrecognizable structures of the face (tape eyes shut before adding simulation if needed to avoid blood in the eyes.)</li> <li>Moderate bleeding/ clotted blood on face.</li> </ul>
