Assault - INDIVIDUAL SCENARIO (AMFR) – ARM BANDED INDIVIDUAL

Background Scenario

You are supporting a member of the campus response team when you receive a call for assistance from the campus police. You are requested to attend the scene of an assault. The campus police inform you that the area is safe and they will be able to provide you with an officer for your safety.

There will be a 3 minute warning to the judges to signify the end of the primary survey.
There will also be a 2 minute left signal for the competitor's benefit.

(BACKGROUND – NOT TO BE SHARED WITH COMPETITORS)

The competitor is asked to attend the scene of an assault between two students. The campus police have secured the scene and identified one student with stab wounds.

INJURIES

- Open wound on right upper chest quadrant, minor bleeding (penetrating stab wound, approx 1 inch long, should look like a fairly minor wound)
- Open wound to right anterior forearm, (3-inch laceration beginning approximately 2 inches above the wrist and running diagonally across the forearm), minor bleeding (defensive knife wound)
- Blood on both hands (from arm & chest wounds)
- 2 small stab wounds to the right back, half way down (Minor bleeding)
- Shock (pale & diaphoretic)

CASUALTY PROMPTS

- Casualty is found lying on his left side, curled in the fetal position, with both hands over the chest wound.
- Casualty was confronted at knifepoint and attempted to fight off attacker. Casualty remembers being hit in the stomach, collapsing to the ground and being kicked by the attacker.
- Casualty did not lose consciousness, and has no neck pain.
- Casualty is conscious throughout scenario.
- Casualty is alert & fully oriented initially – answers questions accurately and obeys commands
- Towards the end of the scenario, casualty becomes drowsy and confused, and if asked does not know where he is or what time it is.
- Casualty is feeling nauseated.
- Casualty has environmental allergies.
- Casualty has a past medical history of asthma and ADHD.
- Casualty had a full meal about four hours ago.

PROPS

- Knife or Screwdriver
- Cell Phone
- School Bag
- Text Books
- Baseball Cap
- Cutable shirt/sweater(hoodie)
- Medication Containers (Adderal pills and Ventolin MDI)

BYSTANDER'S (Campus Police) PROMPTS

- IF ASKED. Casualty told you he had been attacked.
- IF ASKED. The mugger has left the scene (being chased by campus police).
- IF ASKED. Scene is secure (safe for responder to enter).
- IF ASKED. You cannot assist with first aid as you need to control the crowd.
- IF ASKED. You will secure the weapon.
