Good luck! You have 20 minutes to complete the scenario.

There will be a 5 minute cue and a 2 minutes left warning

SPECIFIC PATIENT PROMPTS AND CUES FOR TEAMS AND JUDGES:

TIME CUES:

A ***five minute warning*** will be given - this will signify the end of scoring points in the ESM / Primary Survey part of the score sheet.

A ***two minute remaining*** cue will be given to indicate that two minutes of working time remain

A ***problem complete cue will be given at 20 minutes*** from the start of the problem. No additional time is to be allowed for any reason (ie. PCR, etc)

PATIENT PROMPTS:

While you were walking and watching the soccer tournament you must have tripped over something and fell really hard on the grass. Your head hurts and you can't move your Rt arm very well.

-Allergies: Demerol

- Medications: Coumadin 2.5mg everyday (if asked about your last INR results, you are not sure what it was)

- Medical history – Atrial Fibrillation

PATIENT SIMULATION INFORMATION

PROPS:

-None

INJURIES:

- Horizontal 3cm long laceration to **centre** of forehead bleeding freely.
- Embedded piece of glass in palm of **left** hand with minor bleeding.
- Closed fracture of the **right** clavicle (collarbone).
- No LOC, but slightly confused

POSITIONING:

- Sitting with both arms slightly bent, resting on the patient's thighs.
